

SANDY RUN OUTDOORS CWP CLASS REQUIREMENTS & REFRESHER CWP COURSE INFORMATION

CWP CLASS:

- **NEW APPLICANTS** - This is an **ALL DAY** class. Do not expect to get out early. The class usually last between 10-12 hours. You will need to be here by 7:45 A.M. The class will begin at 8:00 A.M.
- **WEAPON** - Unload Handguns & All Magazines Before Bringing into the classroom or the store
- **HOLSTER/BELT** – You must have a **STRONG SIDE** holster and belt
- **AMMUNITION** – Sandy Run Outdoors has a full line of jacketed target grade ammunition for purchase for those attending the CWP class. You will need 100 rounds for new applicants.
- **PROTECTION** - Proper Ear and Eye protection must be worn on the range during qualification
- **ATTIRE** - NO flip flops, sandals, and no tank tops are allowed on range during qualification. You should have an outer garment in order to draw from concealment.
- **NOTEBOOK** – Bring a notebook & pencil to class to take notes
- **LUNCH** – We will NOT leave for lunch, please bring a bagged lunch with you to the class.
- **VETERANS** – If you are a veteran, please provide your DD214 form, which will be submitted to SLED with package.
- **DISABLED VETERANS** – If you are a disable veteran, please provide your DD214 form and a copy of your disability forms which will be submitted to SLED with package.

REFRESHER CWP CLASS:

- **REFRESHER** – For those who have had their permit for sometime now; Sandy Run Outdoors offers a Refresher Course. This is an opportunity to sit in a regularly scheduled CWP Class to review the laws & basic fire arm instruction and participate in the range qualification. (Once the range qualification is completed you may be dismissed from the class.) **COST: \$35.00**

TRAINING

- **ONE -ON-ONE TRAINING:** The instructor offers one-on-one training. The cost is:
 - **\$20 per hour** or
 - **\$50 for half a day**

- **BRING YOUR LUNCH**

GUN SAFETY RULES:

1. Treat ALL firearms as they were loaded.

2. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction.

3. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until the gun is pointed at the target and you intend to fire.

4. Be sure of your target and what is beyond it.
